Subject: Hurricane Milton - Update #3

As of the 8:00 A.M. update by the National Hurricane Center, Hurricane Milton is located approximately 545 miles Southwest of Tampa North and has experienced a decrease in wind speeds, down to 145mph sustained winds. Movement of Milton has slowed slightly which has resulted in a projected landfall Thursday early A.M. The projected path has not changed since the last update with landfall forecasted in the Tampa Bay and surrounding area.

Collier County remains under the following Watches and Warnings:

- A Flood Watch is in effect through October 10, 2024. A Flood Watch is issued when conditions are favorable for flooding. It does not mean flooding will occur, but it is possible.
- A **Hurricane Watch** which is an announcement that sustained winds of 64 knots (74 mph or 119 km/hr) or higher are possible within the specified area in association with a tropical, subtropical, or post-tropical cyclone. We are not currently under a Hurricane Warning like areas north of us, but we are under a Tropical Storm Warning.
- A Storm Surge Watch which means the possibility of life-threatening inundation from rising
 water moving inland from the shoreline somewhere within the specified area, generally within
 48 hours, in association with an ongoing or potential tropical cyclones, a subtropical cyclone
 or a post-tropical cyclone.

Due to the projected timing of landfall for Milton, we have adjusted the implementation of the RED Team. The adjusted plan is for the Red Team to arrive at the respective communities by 8:00 A.M. on Wednesday with the Blue Team being released today at close of business.

We encourage residents to complete final preparations today. Publix will be executing an early closure on Tuesday with stores closing at 3 P.M. During a state of emergency declared by the Governor, medications can be refilled early at your regular pharmacy.

As we continue to monitor the storm, look forward to additional updates. Specific community instructions will be provided each respective community.
