Subject: Hurricane Milton - Update #5

As of the 5:00 P.M. update by the National Hurricane Center, Hurricane Milton remains a major Hurricane with winds of 120mph moving Northeast at 17mph. Since the last update there has been no change to the path of Milton. Hurricane Milton is still projected to make landfall sometime between 10:00 P.M. and midnight tonight. in the Sarasota/Port Charlotte area.

Collier County remains under the following Watches and Warnings:

- A Flood Watch is in effect through October 10, 2024. A Flood Watch is issued when conditions are favorable for flooding. It does not mean flooding will occur, but it is possible.
- A **Hurricane Watch** which is an announcement that sustained winds of 64 knots (74 mph or 119 km/hr) or higher are possible within the specified area in association with a tropical, subtropical, or post-tropical cyclone. We are not currently under a Hurricane Warning like areas north of us, but we are under a Tropical Storm Warning.
- A Storm Surge Watch which means the possibility of life-threatening inundation from rising
 water moving inland from the shoreline somewhere within the specified area, generally within
 48 hours, in association with ongoing or potential tropical cyclones, a subtropical cyclone or a
 post-tropical cyclone.



We encourage residents to continue to remain indoors during this storm. We will continue to see very strong bands of weather come through our area. These bands will bring strong winds, rain and the potential for tornadoes. Residents are reminded that if a tornado warning is issued, immediately move to an interior space away from windows. Please be advised that Naples instituted a curfew at 4 P.M. today until it is rescinded.

The Red team partners will remain on the communities throughout the night to respond to emergencies. In the morning, Moorings Park will make an assessment based on forecasted conditions as to transitioning to the Blue Team and beginning recovery operations.

As we continue to monitor the storm, look forward to additional updates. Specific community instructions will be provided to each respective community.
